Scripture Readings
January 24, 2016
Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Nehemiah 8:2-4a, 5-6, 8-10

Ezra gathered the people and read to them from the book of the Law of God. He interpreted the law clearly, so that everyone understood what he had read. He then told them to go and rejoice in the Lord.

Second Reading: I Corinthians 12:12-30

Paul explains that a body is composed of many different parts, and that each part has its' own purpose and is important. He compares this to the Church, describing how we are one body composed of many members. All members should show concern for each other and understand that we are all vital to the body as a whole.

Gospel: Luke 1:1-4, 4:14-21

Luke discusses his decision to write about the events he and the other disciples had witnessed. He begins by telling of Jesus reading a passage from the book of Isaiah, where the anointed one is portrayed. Jesus finished by telling the people that they had seen that passage fulfilled in their hearing.

From the Desk of Fr. Jared

In this Jubilee Year of Mercy we are encouraged to join in prayer, go to confession, and share the Catholic faith with others. The purpose of the Jubilee Year is to help us grow spiritually, strengthen our faith, and encourage works of service. The last Jubilee Year was in 2000, called for by Pope Saint John Paul II. In a Jubilee Year we can receive a plenary indulgence. A plenary indulgence removes all purgation, that is the purification necessary following the forgiveness of sin. Pope Francis is granting a Plenary Indulgence to all who make a pilgrimage and pass through the Holy Door, whether in Rome or one's own diocese. The image of the Holy Door recalls how Jesus referred to himself as "the door" or "the gate" as the Good Shepherd. Entering the door evokes movement from the outside where there is danger to the inside where there is safety. Passing through the Holy Door manifests our desire to enter more fully into the sheepfold of the Good Shepherd who protects us and wraps us in his grace. To gain the indulgence, one must pass through the door, celebrate the sacrament of reconciliation, receive communion, recite the creed, and pray the Our Father for the intentions of the Holy Father. There are two locations for the Holy Door in our diocese: St. Margaret of Scotland Church, Morristown, and Shrine of St. John Paul II at Holy Rosary Church, Passaic. "We who receive the abundant mercy of God are called to share that mercy with others. By our charitable acts, no matter how small, we relieve human misery and continue in our day the Jubilee that Jesus began. By our kindness and compassion to others, we stand before Christ who promises us: "Blessed are the merciful, for they shall obtain mercy" (Bishop Serratelli).

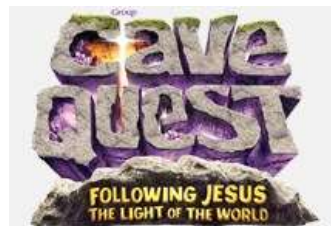
