### Scripture Readings March 26, 2017 Fourth Sunday of Lent

#### First Reading: 1 Samuel 16:1b, 6-7, 10-13a

In seeking a King for the Israelites, Samuel traveled to Jesse of Bethlehem, who had seven sons. Commanded by God to ignore the elder sons, Samuel anointed the youngest, David.

#### Second Reading: Ephesians 5:8-14

Paul exhorts the Ephesians to live as "children of light" in goodness and truth and to avoid evil deeds "done in darkness."

#### Gospel: John 9:1-41

Jesus performs the miracle of giving sight to the man born blind. Because Jesus performed this miracle on the Sabbath, the Pharisees called him a "sinner," but the blind man said, "He is a prophet." Jesus later reveals to the blind man that He is the Son of Man.

#### From the Desk of Fr. Jared

Lent is an outstanding season of the Church's liturgical year. It stands out in many ways. There are no flowers in the church. The rubrics (the instructions of the church regarding liturgical practice) suggest that the only exception to this is on special feasts and solemnities such as the Solemnity of St. Joseph (March 20 this vear), the Solemnity of the Annunciation (March 25), and "Laetare" Sunday, the Fourth Sunday of Lent, March 26. This reminds us of the need to enter the metaphorical desert during this season. The Penitential Rite at each Mass will opt for the praying of the Confiteor (I confess to almighty God) followed by the chanting of the Kyrie Eleison (Lord have mercy). This will highlight for us the penitential nature of the season and help us to more intently "acknowledge our sins, and so prepare ourselves to celebrate the sacred mysteries." The Gloria is not sung or recited except on the solemnities mentioned above. The first time the Gloria is sung is at the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday. It is then not sung until the Easter Vigil. The Gospel Acclamation Alleluia is not sung before the gospel, but is replaced by Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ, King of endless glory. The next time the Alleluia is sung is at the Easter Vigil. Both the Gloria and the Alleluia are omitted during Lent to highlight the simplicity of the season and to build up to the Easter celebration which calls for the Gloria and Alleluia in a high degree of solemnity. Something that is unique to St. Catherine's is the singing of Dona Nobis Pacem at the end of each Mass. This allows us as a community to pray for peace in our lives. Mass is a public, communal prayer. We all bring individual prayers to the Mass, but ultimately the Eucharist is a communal prayer. Singing hymns (all the time) is one sign of that communal prayer. Prayer is one of traditional practices of Lent, in addition to fasting and almsgiving, and to pray as a parish family is a great blessing.

These external symbols (or lack thereof) remind us of our need to empty ourselves this Lent of those things that prevent us from experiencing all of the love that God desires to give us. We each have things in our life that need to be emptied so that we may be renewed and experience the peace we all long for. I write this in between hearing confessions on Monday evening in the space where we come to empty ourselves to God so that he can heal us. I wish that I did not have the time to write an article as I sit between confessions. What a great gift the sacrament is! What a healing experience for those who receive it! As we journey through the days of Lenten springtime (although two feet of snow is predicted for tomorrow...Tuesday), let us enter into its spirit by anticipating the new life which comes to us through Jesus' resurrection at Easter. First though, we need to make room in our life for it.
