**Scripture Readings
 February 12, 2017
 Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

First Reading: Sirach 15:15-20

This passage from Sirach gives strong, unequivocal emphasis to free will in every person. Before each of us is set, sin or virtue, life or death, and each of us are free to choose the one or the other.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 2:6-10

Paul explains to the Corinthians that there are two different kinds of wisdom — the wisdom of God and the wisdom of the world. The wisdom of God is mysterious, but this wisdom has been revealed “to those who love him” through the Spirit.

Gospel: Matthew 5:17-37

In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus tells the people he has come to fulfill the law. He speaks strongly against murder and anger, against adultery and lust, and against false oaths and lies. He warns the people that unless their virtue exceeds that of the Pharisees, they “will not enter the kingdom of God.”

Service is a hallmark of Christianity. As Jesus said, “The Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve” (Matthew 20:28). Therefore, as a Catholic community, we place service as one of the characteristics that defines us here at St. Catherine. We offer many opportunities to serve for people of all ages. We especially encourage our younger parishioners, those in middle school and high school, to consider serving in the parish in one way or another. Those in seventh and eighth grade are asked to consider reading. This is the age that I began to read in my parish. Those in high school are asked to consider serving as a reader or in our music ministry. Those who have been confirmed are invited to consider, in addition to reading and music ministry, to be an extraordinary minister of Holy Communion. We stress the importance of service for our students preparing for Confirmation by asking them to take part in service activities. This is not simply to check off a requirement, but to develop a habit, a virtue of service.

Our youth ministry is organizing a service/mission trip for this coming summer which is sponsored by *Catholic Heart Work Camp (CHWC)*. Young people can make a difference by helping others through organized and meaningful service projects along with many other young people from around the country. Opportunities include: travel to and visit another city, learn more about what it means to be a Catholic, assist those in poverty, participate in praise and worship music, interact with other Catholic young people throughout the country, deepen faith through the sacraments of Eucharist and Reconciliation, witness the faith to others, feel fulfilled and satisfied, and put faith into action. This summer I, along with two other adults, will be taking ten of our high school students to Chicago to participate in *CHWC* July 16th-22nd.

As we plan for this trip, I ask you to please pray for all of our young people in the parish and for the success of this trip. We ask for your support through prayer and any other way that would assist us in our travels. “The Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve.” We are all called to serve and to give of ourselves in different ways. May God continue to bless you all!
