Maybe being a catechist is something you feel God is calling you to, but you have some reservations. Joe Paprocki, a former Director of Religious Education came up with some reasons why he thinks that people hesitate to volunteer to be a catechist. I am reprinting them here with Joe's permission.

"I'm hesitant to become a catechist because..." "...I'm not sure that I have anything to share. I'm not that holy; I'm just a regular person."

Teaching religion is not just about passing on facts for memorization. In addition to helping the children learn about God, the catechist must help the young people to know who Jesus is and to have a relationship with Jesus. Your relationship with God probably happened as part of a process, not all of a sudden. You can share some of how you got to where you are with God now.

As far as not being holy enough goes, let's look at the example of the canonized saints. They considered themselves regular people, too. They love God with all their mind, with all their heart, and with all their strength. Does that sound like someone else you know?

Looking ahead, we will hold an Advent Family Day and a Lenten Family Day. To help organize these events, I will be putting together a committee over the summer, so please consider being part of this committee.
