First Reading: Jonah 3:1-5, 10
Jonah set out for Nineveh as God asked and told the people that their city would be destroyed in forty days. The people believed him and repented from their evil ways. God did not destroy their city, showing his mercy for those who see the evil of their ways and correct it.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 7:29-31
Paul advises the Corinthians that their world is changing, so they should not take their daily trials too seriously. We should remember that the problems of everyday living will not last forever, but the eternal life God promises us will.

Gospel: Mark 1:14-20
Jesus observes Simon and Andrew where they are fishing and tells them to come with him and become "fishers of men." They abandon their nets without hesitation to follow him. Next he calls James and his brother John, who also leave what they are doing and follow him without question.

Happy Ordinary Time! I wish to take this opportunity to thank you for the many ways in which you support your parish family with time, talent, and treasure. It is through your generosity in all of these ways that we are able to continue the good ministry that we do at St. Catherine's. As you know, it has been the tradition to have second collections twice a month. One collection is for the Diocesan Assessment which is "tax" that each parish pays to the diocese. This monthly collection *significantly* helps pay the Assessment. The other monthly second collection supports different ministries in the larger Church. Such collections typically include, but are not limited to: Church in Central and Eastern Europe, Campaign for Human Development, Peter's Pence/Holy Father, South American & Latin American Missions/Catholic Relief Services, Catholic Communications/Catholic University/Black & Indian Missions, and World Mission Sunday.

Beginning now, we will discontinue *most* of the second collections for logistical purposes. We will keep the following second collections:

1. **Monthly Diocesan Assessment**
2. **June:** Seminarian Education Fund
3. **July:** Dame Marie
4. **August:** Mission Co-op Appeal
5. **December:** Retired Religious

These changes will be reflected in your envelope package or your electronic giving profile. Whereas, we will not physically have a second collection for the above noted collections, the parish *will provide* the Diocese with a monthly donation as we always do for those collections. Therefore, I ask you to please increase your weekly offertory accordingly.
